

HockeyEd Renewal

The education of coaches and officials is extremely important to the ongoing development of hockey in Australia. Accreditation renewal is equally important as it ensures that hockey's coaches and officials remain educated and informed on knowledge, experience and skills required for the modern game.

What is accreditation renewal?

Accreditation Renewal involves completing various tasks in a four year period following the successful completion of a Hockey Australia Coaching or Officiating Training Program to remain current, unless a higher level of accreditation is gained during this four year period. Hockey Australia recommends that all coaches and officials who become accredited continue to advance their knowledge and experience.

HockeyEd Renewal Process 2013:

The new Hockey Ed renewal process as agreed upon by the States/Territories Development Managers effective from October 1st 2012, is as follows:

Accreditation following successful completion of a specific level of HockeyEd will be valid for 4 years from the date of initial accreditation.

There is no longer a requirement to pay \$40 per annum to renew.

A \$40 renewal fee is required four years following the initial accreditation. \$20 of this fee will be returned to the States/Territories to assist with the cost of conducting renewal activities.

Hockey Ed members will be expected to undertake professional development activities in each of the four years that the accreditation is valid.

HA in conjunction with the both the Development Managers and members of the officiating fraternity are currently updating the required professional development activities. These requirements will be uploaded to the HA site when complete.

HockeyEd members will be required to submit evidence of their professional development activities at the end of the 4 year window to their respective State/Territory association.

How do I renew my accreditation?

Step 1: Complete the online renewal [registration form](#). The registration fee covers the cost of renewing your accreditation and a HockeyEd Membership (valid for four years). **Please Note: Until further notice the above link will take you directly to the HockeyEd Moodle platform where you can choose which accreditation you would like to renew.**

Step 2: Complete the relevant renewal requirements for your level of accreditation.

Step 3: Provide evidence of completion to your state/ territory association (Community, Level 1 and Level 2 levels) or Hockey Australia (Advanced and High Performance/ National levels).
